Helpers ARE Important

It may seem to you that we are always asking for helpers for events at which FDRC Riders are competing, but it is actually a condition of entry that we send one helper for a whole day per team or 2 individual riders. So one team and two individuals competing would mean we had to send two helpers for a whole day, if we cannot provide helpers, our riders would not be allowed to compete. If we have enough volunteers the Club can send two people to cover one slot i.e.two helpers for half a day each to cover one slot. Riders can also help by volunteering for competitions at which they are not riding.

correct fitting of a side saddle (supplied on the day) to your horse, then you get on and try it under the watchful eye of Rebekah.

For those who attended the first session, Rebekah will be able to work with you on moving on with your horse. The saddle will again be fitted and further instruction on now to improve.

Bring friends and cameras for this excellent opportunity to see if you enjoy this wonderful elegant way of riding.

You will need to be wearing a fitted riding hat to current BRC standard, riding gloves, and long boots without buckles, (in addition to your regular riding wear).

1 DAY FULL TREC at Levels 1 & 2 on Sept 20th 2025 at Knowler Farm, Stelling Minnis

Classes for level 1 and level 2, for pairs and individuals, which will all also be TREC GB Championship qualifiers.

For those new to TREC here is a brief explanation, it is a three part competition,

which you can do as an individual or a pair as it's a one day competition it will be run in the following order.

ME: Control of Paces – where you ride one way along a 2m wide corridor in canter as slow as possible and then back the other way in walk as fast as possible without breaking pace.

PTV – Obstacles – You negotiate a course of 16 obstacles such as a gate, S bend, Reinback etc You get a mark for each obstacle and if you don't wish to do any you may miss one and get 0 as long as you inform the Judge.

POR:- Orienteering – You copy the master map onto the plain copy you are given and then set out to follow the route passing through checkpoints on the way.

Level 1 – 150m COP – 16 Obstacles PTV – up to 15 km POR

Level 2 – 150m COP – 16 Obstacles PTV – up to 20km POR

Level 1 is suitable for beginners so if you have never ridden in any TREC, or have done the Winter Arena TREC but never tackled the map reading or if you are a seasoned Treccie this is the competition for you.

HELPERS NEEDED AS WELL AS COMPETITORS - This competition takes a lot of people to run and we have always had good support from the FDRC members at past events, as well as friends and families and hope many of you enjoyed your experiences and will join us again,

THE FDRC JOINED THE E-RIDERS - VIRTUAL DRESSAGE COMPETITION







NOTE TO RIDERS WHO COMPETE IN TEAMS & AREA COMPETITIONS

We are Re-Vamping our Team Form that **MUST** be filled in before you compete in any competitions representing the FDRC as a member of a Team or as an Individual. We feel that perhaps we have not explained certain things clearly enough. The new form will be emailed to all members and will take the place of the old version.

Before you actually get to a competition you MUST send in certain pages of your horses passport to the team manager – the pages that contain ALL vaccines (not just the recent ones) and the page with the horses name on it.

On the day of the competition you MUST always bring your HORSES PASSPORT, YOUR RIDING HAT(S) and BODY PROTECTOR(S) to the Secretary's as they need to be checked on the day by an official. This is very important as if you do not present these to the Secretary you will be <u>Disqualified</u> from the competition and obviously this not only affects you but your team.
