I think the big take home from the show this year was that riders need reminding that -: You must keep your <u>horse passport</u> with your horse, pony or donkey whenever it is transported. The text above is taken from the government website.

I know there are not many competitions now a days when your horse or pony's passport is checked, but it is not just a request from the British Riding Clubs to conform to the rules for qualifiers and championships, it is the law. So even though we check your passport and vaccination record prior to the competition, it still needs to be shown to the declaration team at the event. BRC also uphold the rule, that a horse or pony cannot compete if it has a vaccination in the 7 days before the event. This rule can only be upheld if we see the passport on the day. I hope everyone appreciates the importance of this request, it is there to safeguard our equines and it is our duty with regard to their welfare.

Next year the Combined Training NAF Five Star Qualifier will move to the summer season for the first time, following changes to the British Riding Clubs event calendar. See you next year!? xx
