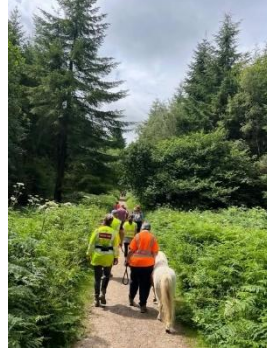

We will highlight competitions as we go through the year asking for riders & helpers by Email, Facebook and the Website. Please keep a look out and let the designated Team Manager know if you are interested in being in a specific team.

FDRC MEMBERS POINTS LEAGUE

As you will have seen from the AGM report the FDRC Members Points League is worth joining.

Entry £10.00 will be via MRL and is now OPEN.

To enter you need to go into your MRL account and search for Faversham & District – Take OUT your post code & mileage and it should magically appear!!

This is a very simple points league but with lots of prizes. ***Remember “points mean prizes!”***

On entering you will be sent a points card to complete during the year. for events in which you take part.

This covers competitions run by FDRC plus competitions NOT run by FDRC, FDRC Training, FDRC Social Events, Running an event & Helping at FDRC events gets you even more points!!

Fill in the form and ask the Event, Secretary, trainer or organiser (or Committee Member who may be present) to confirm and sign your card.

The League runs from the 1st January to 31st December 2025 with the prizes being allocated at the 2025 AGM (Feb 2026) - You can, of course, enter this at any time during the year.

REDHORSE DRESSAGE 2025 FDRC MEMBERS POINTS LEAGUE – WILLOW FARM EC

An extra way of getting a little more out of your dressage tests. When you enter a class or classes at a Redhorse Dressage Competition at Willow Farm and you tell Sue Barradell 'who runs the shows, that you are an FDRC Member - your placings are converted to points for the FDRC Red Horse Dressage league. Sue runs the points system for FDRC members, which runs from February 2025 to Jan 2026.

PLUS at each show the highest placed FDRC Member gets a lovely rosette

Big bold fences, plenty of combinations, 2 water jumps and undulating ground made for an interesting competition. Certainly a championship standard course. Even after the dressage it was still all to play for. I had the most amazing time with incredible and friendly people, made new friends and met up with some old.

My horse faced all the challenges head on and made me the most proud owner/rider I could ever be. We produced a lovely double clear finishing on our dressage score of 30.8 gaining us 8th place. I was absolutely over the moon to finish in the top 10 in a National championship.

I Will absolutely be aiming to qualify next year, hopefully in the 100!

After a long journey Rolo and I arrived at the BRC SEIB National Horse Trials Championships.

After settling Rolo in to his stable we then had the fun task of trying to put the tent up this took us a fair amount of time lol. With the tent finally up we had a quick dinner and went to bed.

The next morning I took Rolo for a nice hand graze before bringing him up to the horsebox to wash the poo stains off and start plaiting up for the dressage. I was feeling very nervous but Rolo was nice and relaxed and we

performed a ok test of 32.2.

Next up was the showjumping. I let my nerves get the better of me and ended up too close to roll a pole Rolo did his best to help me out and we finished the round with the just the 1 pole down and 4 faults which left us in 18th place overnight.

Sunday was x-country day and after warming up well we were off to the start box, unfortunately the course was a lot more technical than we were used to and Rolo did not feel like he was taking me forward to the jumps we then had 2 refusals at the trekhaner and I retired as I felt he was not enjoying it and we were both losing confidence.



Although it didn't go as planned and I was disappointed not to finish we had a lovely weekend representing the club and would love to qualify again.
